#### Y6 Leavers Assembly - Thursday 20th July

Next Thursday will see a day full of celebration for our Year 6 pupils who are coming to the end of an amazing 7 years at Four Oaks Primary. They will perform their Leavers Assembly for the rest of the children on Wednesday morning, but at 9.15am on Thursday all Year 6 parents can come along to the Infant Hall to watch the children perform, and be involved with a presentation of some gifts that the PTA have funded for Year 6.

After this celebration Year 6 parents can then stay for lunch with their child and partake in Debbie's dinners for possibly the very last time. If parents want to stay for lunch they must go through 'School Money' to book a lunch. Please be aware that this is an opportunity to have lunch just with Year 6 pupils at this special time, so siblings will not be able to come out of class to join you.

#### Transfer to Secondary School in 2024

Next week all Birmingham maintained Primary, Junior and All-Through schools will be sent a letter which will be distributed to their current Year 5 pupils born between 01/09/2012 - 31/08/2013, who live in Birmingham and do not have an



Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP). There is key information included regarding deferred entry and children being taught outside of their normal year group, so it is important that this letter is read carefully. Parent/carers will be able to submit an online application from 1 September 2023 and are urged to apply for their child to transfer to secondary school by the **national closing date of 31 October 2023**. Further Information about the application process will be available on the council's website from 1 September 2023.

#### Arthur Terry Open Evening

The date of the Arthur Terry Open Evening for next year's cohort has now been set and will take place on Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> September with the doors opening at 6pm.

#### Attendance Reminder

We would like to congratulate the many parents who make sure their children attend school regularly and I'm sure they will see a reflection of this in their child's academic performance.

Absence from school always disrupts the education of individual pupils and research shows that children who do not attend regularly do not achieve well in exams, find it difficult to cover lost ground academically, and can find it difficult to maintain friendships as they grow up.

I would like to point out to all parents that Four Oaks Primary School will be working in partnership with the other LTE schools and the Local Authority from September to renew our efforts to improve school attendance. Please remember that family holidays in term time are not allowed in law and are unlikely to be authorised. Family emergencies also need careful consideration. It is not always appropriate or in the best interests of the child to miss school for emergencies which are being dealt with by adult family members. Parents MUST notify school of any planned leave in term time, but this does not necessarily mean it will be authorised.

Please note that from September, where parents fail to ensure their child attends school regularly, legal action, including penalty notices, may be considered by the Local Authority. The Governing Body of Four Oaks Primary School are in full support of this positive action to improve pupils life chances.


