LTE Deep Dive

The Learning Trust for Excellence (LTE) is the group of schools that Four Oaks Primary is in a collaborative relationship with, for the benefit of all of the schools and all of the children. As part of our on-going work with the LTE we visit each other's schools on a regular basis to do 'deep dives' in different areas of the curriculum to assess what we do, and then measure the impact on the children. In the last two years we have carried out deep dives in Reading and Mathematics, but this year we have put the focus on Geography. Just over two weeks ago, Head Teachers and Curriculum Leaders from three other LTE schools visited Four Oaks and carried out this mini-inspection of Geography. I am happy to say that our visitors were very impressed by what they saw as they spoke with staff and observed our children. Here are just a few of the things that they said:

The quality of the curriculum that has been provided by staff is a real strength.

High quality displays/working walls were seen in all classrooms & in the school hall. This clearly helps children understand the learning journey.

It was clear that the staff were committed to ensuring that Geography was taught well within the school.

The enthusiasm & hard work of the curriculum leader & subject co-ordinator was very clear for all to see.

This kind of experience, working with other supportive schools, enables us to reflect on our everyday practice and to be open to a variety of curriculum ideas used in other successful schools, and we will continue to engage with our co-operative trust as we head towards the Spring term.

Staffing News

Sadly, we will have some staff moving on to pastures new at the end of this term. Mrs Arnett has been our Bursar working in our Infant office for the past 16 years, but she has decided to move onto a new chapter. 



School Attendance and Holiday in Term-Time Requests—Local Authority Fines Here at school, we are still receiving requests from parents for holiday leave in term-time. As I stated in one of my Summer Term newsletters, the Local Authority are now taking a much firmer stance with these kinds of requests, and I have been asked to publicise the fact that we have now had 2 further fines of £60 per parent per child sent out to families from Four Oaks. The Local Authority will continue to do this, as holiday requests during time when children should be in school, will always be unauthorised. This is part of a concerted partnership between all Birmingham schools and the City Council to maximize children's life chances by trying to improve attendance rates, and therefore opportunities to learn, and fulfil their potential.

Absence from School

We are still having issues with some parents not phoning into school when their child is going to be absent from school either through illness, medical appointments or other appointments. If your child is absent please **telephone the school office**. Please **do not** email enquiry or teachers for this purpose as emails cannot always be picked up in time for the register to be completed. As parents should be aware we now have a dedicated line for absences (option 3 on the telephone menu) which means that the call can be made even before school opens if this is more convenient. Please remember to call every day of an absence unless advised otherwise by the office team. In addition if you are filling in a 'Pupil Term Time Leave' request form this should be submitted **as soon as you are aware of the event** not just a day or two before as these need to be processed. Thank you for your co-operation.
