## **Measles** Vaccinations

As you will probably be aware, the spread of Measles has been in the news over recent months, with a higherthan-average number of cases across Birmingham, and now London. Over the last few months, we have twice put out a letter from Birmingham Environmental Public Health Department urging all parents to get their young children vaccinated against this potentially dangerous and highly infectious disease. So far, we have not had a single case of Measles in school, and will keep promoting this message to keep our children safe. We have attached the warning letter from Birmingham Public Health Department to the end of this newsletter and urge all parents to read it.

## SATs Results - Top of the Pile!

We are super proud that last week, it was announced that in Birmingham, two schools - Four Oaks Primary School and St. James' Catholic Primary School, led the way last year across the whole education authority in the Key Stage 2 SATs results, with 90% of all Year 6 pupils achieving the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. This fact reflects how hard all of my staff work with their pupils over the 7 years of their school lives, and how supportive you all are as parents, to make sure that every child has an opportunity to do their very best. Well done everyone!

## **Bishop Vesey Athletics**

On Wednesday last week Mrs Evans and Miss Appleby took some of our Y3 and Y4 pupils to Bishop Vesey to compete in an indoor athletics competition. They were absolute superstars and represented Four Oaks superbly. At the end of the competition the boys walked away with silver medals, the girls walked away with bronze medals, and the school came third overall. A huge well done to all pupils and staff involved!

## Parkour Lessons

As we are affiliated members of the Wilson Stuart Partnership, which is how we compete in so many sporting events, we have had the opportunity to trial 'Parkour' for all children from Years 1 - 6. This will give the children a taster into the sport and signpost them to where they can participate in it if they enjoy it. These sessions have started this week and will continue for one year group at a time for the next 6 school weeks.

## **NSPCC Number Day**





#### Measles (MMR) Vaccine Reminder

As half term approaches, this is an ideal time to get up to date with the measles (MMR) vaccination. There has been a recent rise in measles cases across the country. Birmingham and Solihull have low MMR vaccination rates and there is a risk of a measles outbreak this winter.

Measles is a highly infectious disease, which can be very serious. The MMR vaccination is recommended to help protect you, your child and loved ones against measles. Two doses of the MMR vaccine are needed to get the best protection. The vaccination is free of charge.

Anyone unvaccinated who is exposed to someone with measles may be advised to isolate for 3 weeks. This would disrupt their learning or work, and this could happen repeatedly. If exposure happened again, another 3 week isolation period would be required each time.

Children and adults can catch up on any missed vaccinations by contacting their GP practice. Children should have the first dose at 1 year old and the second dose at 3 years and 4 months old. Two doses of the MMR can provide life-long immunity.

Vaccination will also help prevent the spread of measles. The MMR vaccination also protects against mumps and rubella.

#### Please contact your GP to book an appointment for Measles (MMR) vaccination.


