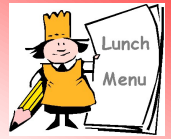

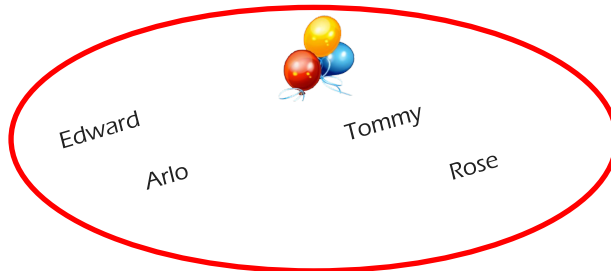

Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust—Grants for School Uniform

A reminder that the Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust is running a scheme whereby parents who reside within the Sutton Coldfield boundaries can apply for a grant of up to £100 per child to help purchase school uniform. If you are in receipt of the following benefits you will be able to make an application:



UNIVERSAL CREDIT, CHILD TAX CREDIT AND/OR WORKING TAX CREDIT, INCOME SUPPORT, EMPLOYMENT SUPPORT ALLOWANCE, JOB SEEKERS ALLOWANCE.

If you think you may be eligible for this scheme then please contact Mrs Johnson in the Junior office (0121 675 4040 Option 1) and she will be able to provide you with a form to fill in with our school stamp on. Please note the deadline for completed applications is **Monday 11th March** so please do not delay in requesting your form.
