# Dear Parents and Governors

Welcome back to the start of a new school year and a particularly warm welcome to our new families who have joined us now that all children have settled back into school. We hope that you have all had a very enjoyable summer holiday and are looking forward to the exciting year ahead.

# Pick Up & Drop Off

Can I take this opportunity to say a huge thank you to all of our parents for abiding by our new safety guidelines for pick up and drop off of pupils at the start and end of the school day. Many hours of planning and preparation have gone into the organisation of our new school day in COVID times so I hope that

you all feel that both you and your children are safe when moving around the site. Can I remind parents that if you wish to speak to a member of staff then at present can you telephone

school and make an appointment. If you have made an appointment to come inside the building then we will be asking parents to wear a mask or visor.

I would also ask our Junior parents to please abide by our one way system in moving around the site. Can I finally ask all parents not to park on the zig zags by either entrance in order to maintain the safety of all pupils.

# Clarification of Quarantine Details

On the very first newsletter of the year we sent out details of how long individuals will have to guarantine if they have a positive Covid test themselves or from a family member. These details have now changed in that any individual testing positive must isolate for 10 days from when they first felt ill (not 7 days as we said last week). Other family members must still isolate for 14 days from when the person first fell ill. We would ask all families to abide by this guidance. If your child has a high temperature, persistent cough or any other COVID symptoms we would ask that you keep them off school and book a test. Until we have seen written proof of the test results being negative we are not allowed to let children back into school. We do understand that tests can be difficult to book so please inform us if you are having difficulty.



# Parent Workshops & Parents Evenings

I would ask parents to bear with us in waiting for news of our normal "Meet the Teachers" and Parents' Evenings meetings. Under present Government restrictions it will be almost impossible to run them in the normal way where we invite parents into school 'en masse' as we have done in the past, but we are working on different plans which we will communicate with parents in the very near future. Remember, if you do need to get a message to your child's teacher please tell the member of staff on the gate in the morning or telephone or email school. In this way staff will endeavour to solve any problems.



#### **Copies of Newsletters**

This newsletter can always be accessed through our school website or by using our School Jotter app. We will only distribute paper newsletters to parents who request one, in an aim to save paper. If you received a paper copy last year we will assume that you still want a paper copy. If you no longer require a paper copy please let us know and similarly if you which to receive a paper copy please contact the school office.

#### Attendance and Holidays

I'm delighted to say that we have almost 100% attendance at the start of this new Autumn Term and, as you would expect, as a school we are constantly monitoring the attendance of each pupil. We are delighted to announce that the overall attendance last year was a fantastic 97%, many congratulations to all our pupils. (16 pupils fell below the 90% level.) We are trying to ensure that all pupils achieve 95% attendance and if your child's attendance falls below this level, without medical reason, you will receive a letter informing you of their level of attendance and asking you to try to rectify the situation.

Similarly if your child is constantly late for school you will also receive a letter. Between the ages of 5 and 14 only 14.91% of a child's time is spent in school, so it is very important that their attendance is excellent. A reminder that the Government now dictates that Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence for holidays during term time unless there are highly exceptional circumstances.

This new arrangement has worked perfectly so far so thank you to all parents for being so organized.
