**Dear Parents and Governors**

### Open Day

Next Monday is our school Open Day where any new families to school can come along and have a tour of school, and then speak to Miss Appleby and myself. This is an annual event and helps us as a school to welcome a full cohort of 60 new pupils into school every September.

Any families wishing to look around school can come along to the Infant Department entrance between the times of 9.30am and 2.30pm, and we will look forward once more to showing off our wonderful school.



### Attendance - Leave in Term Time Requests

I would like to make all parents aware that the Local Authority are really tightening up in relation to poor attendance at school. Over the last year our overall school attendance rate has fallen from a figure around 98% to a figure around 95%, and this has been noticed by the Local Authority.

We are legally required to report our attendance figures on a daily basis, and this is one of the first things that Ofsted will look at. The main reason for this fall in attendance is families deciding to take 'Leave in Term-Time', and the vast majority of these instances are with a small minority of families taking unauthorized holidays. I will never be allowed to authorize such requests, and from next week any requests for such leave which end up being not authorised will result in letters from the Local Authority being sent to parents' home addresses, explaining how they are jeopardizing their child's education, and possibly getting into a situation where the Local Authority may decide to issue penalty notices.

I'm sure you would all agree that the most effective way to ensure your children progress to their full potential is to ensure they make use of their legal right to be in school every single day.

### Parents' Workshops

A big thanks to all the parents who came along to our many Parents' Workshops during the first three weeks of school. I hope they proved useful and gave you the opportunity to ask lots of questions about what is in store for your children in this exciting new school year. Remember, any parent can ask questions of staff at any point during the year, either by making an appointment for a chat at the end of the school day, or by contacting staff via email using their class email addresses.

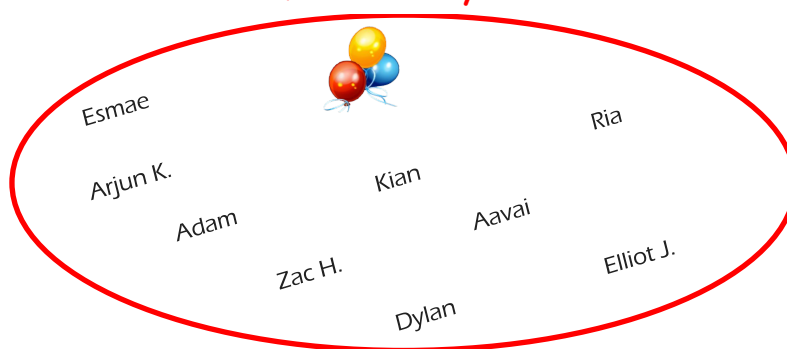

- *Get in touch with someone you know for advice if you are unsure or if something looks like it might be too good to be true.*
- *Never read out or share one time passcodes sent to you by your bank or credit card company.*
- *Never read out or share PIN codes generated by card readers to approve transactions. Only input them online if you know the transaction has been initiated by you. No one should ask you for these codes!*
- *If you receive a call from your bank or credit card company, you can always say no, hang up and call them back on a number you know to be genuine.*
