

Winter Food Boxes

As part of the winter Bring it on Brum! programme supported by the Department of Education and Birmingham City Council; we are pleased to offer families the opportunity to request a free winter food box.

<u>Free food boxes are available for all families and households with children, regardless of benefits-</u> <u>related free-school meal eligibility.</u>

We have partnered with Morrison's to provide a box of cupboard essentials and fresh produce. The contents of the box will include all the ingredients needed to make 4 meals, from a choice of 5 different recipes. All boxes are vegetarian with meat substitutes provided.

Families and households with children who <u>ARE</u> eligible for benefits-related free school meals.

Register for your free winter food box, live from Wednesday 23rd November, registrations will close on Wednesday 30th November or when all available food boxes have been allocated.

One food box is available for each eligible household (not one per child). Eligible households must have at least one child or young person eligible for benefits-related free school meals living there. You will need to enter the details of one eligible child in order to register for a food box, include your Bring it on Brum! code (sometimes called a HAF or FSM code) if you have it already.

Families and households with children who <u>ARE NOT</u> eligible for benefits-related free school meals

Register for your free winter food box, live from Wednesday 23rd November, registrations will close on Wednesday 30th November or when all available food boxes have been allocated.

One food box is available for each household (not one per child). You will need to enter the details of one child who goes to school in Birmingham in order to register for a free food box.

Treasure Trails Family Offer

Turn a regular day into a full-blown adventure... a great way to engage the whole family in a fun day out! Follow a self-guided Treasure Trail through the winding backstreets and hidden corners of towns and cities around Birmingham.

Crack the clues along the route to unlock incredible stories from the past and solve the mystery at the end. Before you know it, you've walked a couple of miles, taken in the highlights, explored new areas and put your heads together as a family and returned home with a massive smile on your face!

Please note this is not an organised activity; this is a self-guided activity pack for Treasure Trails around Birmingham. Families are eligible to apply for one Treasure Trails pack per household (NOT one per child).
