Parent Parking

I will ask all parents yet again to please make sensible and safe decisions when parking on Edge Hill Road at the beginning and the end of the day. If cars are already parked along the school side of the road then please do not then park on the opposite side of the road and, by doing this, making the gap down the middle of the road very narrow. I will also point out that it is not safe to park with two wheels of the car on the pavement. We have many children and parents walking to school, some with pushchairs, and putting obstacles in their way on the pavement is obviously an unsafe thing to do.

I know I am talking about a minority of parents, but we must act sensibly to keep all of our children safe.

Strike Days

As parents may be aware of, various teaching unions have turned down the pay offer set out by the Government, and are asking their members to withdraw their labour on **Tuesday 2nd May 2023**. At the moment I am not aware of any members of staff at Four Oaks going on strike, but if this situation changes as we get closer to this date, then I will inform parents as soon as I know.

Coronation Celebrations

On the afternoon of Friday 5th May, pupils and staff will be celebrating the coronation of King Charles III by taking part in a variety of activities in school. They will begin by taking part in a celebratory buffet party lunch put on by Debbie and her team, and will then all come together for a whole school assembly where they will sing the National Anthem, and think about the new King's hopes and wishes for his reign. As a school we will talk through what will actually happen during the coronation, and the significance of the events that pupils will witness over the weekend. They will listen to our school choir who have been practising a musical celebration for a few weeks now, and then they will go back to classrooms to take part in artistic activities based around the coronation event.



To further enhance the sense of celebration we would like to ask all parents to arrange for their children to come to school on this day in their best party clothes. (We would ask that no children come to school in any sportswear.)



A reminder to all parents that school will be closed on Monday 8^{th} May, as this is now a bank holiday in light of the coronation.



Disinformation and Misinformation

It is common to see misleading information on the internet and particularly on social media. It's important to be aware that what you see may not always be what it seems.

Disinformation is where people intentionally create false or misleading information.

Misinformation is where people share disinformation not realising its false or misleading. Some tips for verifying information:

- Check the quality Low quality images may mean its old
- Check the source Is it a trustworthy source?
- Reverse image search photo's or video frames Reverse Image search allows you to search the web by uploading a photo, results may include objects within the image, similar images or website with the same or similar images.
