Governor Update

Y4 Swimming

Our Year 4 pupils will be starting their swimming unit of study by visiting Wyndley Swimming Baths next week. This activity will help us to support every child in school to hopefully be able to swim at least 25 metres and show some water safety skills by the time they leave Year 6.

The Year 4 teachers will communicate with parents as to which days the children will need their swimming kits. Due to the huge funding cuts that have been placed on us we are concentrating on ensuring all children who can't swim have the maximum amount of time in the pool with qualified instructors.

Vicar's Installation

Next Monday I will attend the installation service for our new Parish vicar, Rev. Leanne Carr. This is a significant event as we have a very close relationship with All Saints Parish Church and they are an important part of school life. I am sure that you will join with me in wishing her the very best for her time in her new post, and we will look forward to her very first visit to Four Oaks Primary.

School Voting Day – British Values

On Tuesday 24th October we will be conducting our annual school voting day. This event is part of our pupils' work around the idea of democracy, within the bigger topic of British Values. Leading up to this day the School Council will have championed different potential charitable bodies that Four Oaks Primary could support during this school year, and then every pupil will get

the chance to cast their vote for whichever charity they think is the most worthy. We would appreciate it if parents could talk to their children at home about this process and help to explain how democracy in our country works. The charities that our children have chosen to cast their vote on are: Cancer Research, The RSPCA, Shelter and Make a Wish Foundation.

Book Fayre

During the week beginning Monday 23rd October the Book Fayre will be visiting school. For every book sold, we as a school get the chance to select a free title, so this is one of the most important ways in which we keep children's reading material up to date. We always tell the children that reading is the key to getting better at every aspect of school life, so we hope that everyone will try to visit, either before or after school. Children will also get the chance to visit to browse through the books during the school day at some point during the week.

Nasal Flu Vaccine

On Friday 27th October all of the children in school will get their nasal flu vaccine. Hopefully this will help to protect the children throughout the Autumn and Winter and enable them to be healthy and learning here in school.

Summer Reading Challenge

We had 104 children take part in the Summer Reading Challenge this year which is incredible. We are very proud to announce that, for the third year running, we have won the trophy for the most children competing the challenge in the whole of Sutton Coldfield. We told our children in assembly on Monday and the cheer of pride could potentially be heard from Mere Green library! The challenge is proven to help with the traditional 'dip' that children have over the Summer with their reading, so we are glad that many of you see the value in it that we do. Thank you so much for your support, we really appreciate it. A representative from the library will be coming to school in a few weeks to present us with the trophy. We will be in touch with an exact date for this so that the children who took part can bring their certificates and medals back in and have a group photo with the award.

This will be an opportunity for children to investigate, observe, discover, challenge, test our ideas and gain a deeper and wider understanding of the world around them.

IDEAS:

 Play eye spy to identify some landscape features such as mountains, fields, ponds, rivers, lakes etc.

- 2. Ask your child to take pictures of these features. They can experiment with the zoom, close-ups and filters.
- 3. Choose a toy and go on an adventure. Take photographs and talk about where they are.
- 4. On an OS map, you could ask your child to find a bridge, wooded areas, watercourses etc.
- 5. Your child could draw a map of their local park, your house and even a room of the house such as their bedroom.
- 6. If you go on a walk with your child, they could take the lead with the map.
- 7. Make a journey stick and pick up items on your walk stick and string are required.
- 8. Go on an observation walk, focusing on just one colour.
 9. They could collect stones and pebbles to recreate the geology of the place you've visited.
- 10. Your child could also do some land art with materials they've found on your outing.
