Dear Parents and Governors

Welcome Back

We hope that all of our Four Oaks' families enjoyed a restful week off and that the pupils have returned to school with renewed energy. This is the mid-point of the school year and we head into our second Spring half-term with lots of anticipation. This half-term will see World Book Day, the Swimming Gala, and Science Week happening in school, and with the return of the lighter evenings we will be excited about re-starting our football and cross-country calendar of events.

Chinese New Year in Reception

Before half-term, the children in our two Reception classes engaged in an enjoyable workshop about 'Lunar New Year'. The children listened to a talk around Lunar New Year which involved learning about the Lunar Calendar, Chinese Zodiac Animals and New Year customs. The children practised learning to say, "Kung Hei Fat Choi" which means 'Happy New Year!' and then all had a turn dancing under the dragon costume as this year is the year of the dragon!



At the end of the workshop, all children were gifted a bright, beautiful red envelope with sweets in. At Lunar New Year, it is tradition to give red envelopes filled with money- known as Hóngbāo- to friends and family. The red colour of these envelopes symbolises good luck and prosperity in Chinese cultures. A huge thank you to the Reception Parents for giving up their time and sharing this wonderful cultural experience with our childrenthey loved it!

Safe Driving and Parking.

Here at school, we were really pleased to receive praise from the Local Authority just before half-term as they publicised information about dangerous parking and driving outside Sutton Schools. They published a list of schools where drivers had been issued with penalty charge notices and a list of schools where drivers had been moved on by traffic enforcement officers even though their dangerous driving and parking fell short of a penalty notice, and we are happy to say that Four Oaks did not feature on either list.

We were however on the list of schools who have been proactive in promoting the safety of their pupils, with our Bronze 'good travel plan' being noted. In addition to this we can let parents know that we are about to have this status upgraded to a Silver 'very good travel plan', which will put us in the top group of Sutton schools alongside Hill West, St. Joseph's and Walmley Infant school.

To maintain this high standard, we would ask all parents to think carefully about children's safety whenever they park or drive around any of the school gates.

Parents' Evening

We hope that all parents were able to come along to one of our two Parents' Evening sessions just before the half-term break to discuss their child's progress with their class teacher.

If for any reason parents were unable to attend, we would kindly ask them to contact school and re-arrange a convenient time to be able to chat to a member of staff.



Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust—Grants for School Uniform

Every year Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust run a scheme whereby parents who reside within the Sutton Coldfield boundaries can apply for a grant of up to £100 per child to help purchase school uniform. If you are in receipt of the following benefits you will be able to make an application:

School Attendance and Holiday in Term-Time Requests—LA Fines

Here at school, we are still receiving requests from parents for holiday leave in term-time. As I stated in one of my Summer Term newsletters, the Local Authority are now taking a much firmer stance with these kinds of requests, and I have been asked to publicise the fact that we have now had 2 further fines of £60 per parent per child sent out to families from Four Oaks. The Local Authority will continue to do this, as holiday requests during term time, when children should be in school, will always be unauthorised. This is part of a concerted partnership between all Birmingham schools and the City Council to maximize children's life chances by trying to improve attendance rates, and therefore opportunities to learn, and fulfil their potential.

The Vicar of All Saints

Yesterday we had our first visit from the Reverend Leanne Carr who is the new vicar at All Saints and Saint James'. She popped into school to have a cup of tea and meet some of the staff and pupils. Hopefully this will be the first of many visits as we work together to maintain the strong links between Four Oaks and All Saints.

KES Concert Event—Symphony Hall


